Just a quick update for what to expect for your WBCCI & TOG membership renewal for 2021! It is that time again, and we hope to have all of you back as members again next year!

HOW TO RENEW MEMBERSHIP

First, many of you long time members may recall that renewals are typically done with triplicate, carbon copy renewal forms, but for 2021, WBCCI has decided to go paperless with online and phone renewals going forward. The renewal form is short and easy, and you can add your TOG membership at the same time! You can renew online at https://airstreamclub.org/current-members/membership-renewal or by calling WBCCI directly at 937-596-5211. Questions about your WBCCI Membership can also be emailed to membership@airstreamclub.org.

If you are a WBCCI member and a member at another park, but would like to be an affiliate member with TOG, you can renew AFFILIATE MEMBERSHIP ONLY

at https://topofgeorgia.airstreamclub.net/wbcci-georgia-unit-application/. Once you submit your form, I will contact you for payment information.

DUES FOR MEMBERSHIP, 2021

WBCCI has raised their annual membership dues to \$75/year beginning in 2021. Top of Georgia Membership dues will remain at \$15/year. Total dues for 2021 for both parks would be \$90/year.

DEADLINE FOR RENEWAL

While there is no official deadline to renew for 2021, if you want to be included in the Blue Beret (WBCCI Membership Directory) and the Top of Georgia Membership Directory, you will need to register by December 31, 2020.

TOG MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Currently, we hold 328 regular members, 8 affiliate members, and 4 honorary members for 2020. We are ever growing, and already have many renewals and new members for 2021!

Top of Georgia is one of the largest (if not largest) Airstream Clubs in the country and I believe that is due to the amazing property and location that we have, but more importantly, because of the dedicated and welcoming members that make up the TOG family!

Summary of Board Actions -2019-2020

Your Board Members discussed a variety of topics during the past year, some that may require Rule or By-Law changes. The majority of the discussions concerned the Park and not the Club.

2020 has been a great year at the TOP in terms of financial gain from a higher occupancy rate. The Public Relations Committee has been busy promoting the park through social media and postcard mailings and people are checking us out! COVID has contributed to this increased interest, due to many campgrounds closing and campers looking for other places to stay.

Topics and accomplishments:

- 1. BUDGET We approved a budget for the park so the entire board did not need lengthy discussions for projects of a few hundred dollars. Our Property Management team managed their budget well and only a few projects required our discussion and vote. The Property Management Team shared with membership all the projects that had been accomplished over the year.
- ACTION ITEM LIST An Action Item List is developed by the Property Management Team, listing current and future projects with estimated completion dates and cost of the project.
- 3. ACCESS To DOCUMENTS An Internet Cloud location was created to house all of our documents, including minutes of board and business meetings, financial reports, membership handbook, rules, by-laws, hosting, Caravanner, Public Relations Committee and others. Presently, this resource is only accessible to Board Members and Committee Chairs. A method for allowing all members "read only" access is underway, so you can peruse the documents without the risk of changing or deleting the documents!
- 4. TRANSPARENT BOARD MEETINGS at the TOP! Unfortunately, we had only two Board

Meetings at the TOP this year. Previous meetings were via Zoom or a conference call program. During the "live" board meetings at the TOP, everyone interested was invited to attend the Board Meetings held in the Pavilion and were frequently invited to participate in the discussions.

5. PARK RULE VIOLATIONS - The toughest discussions concerned trailers/owners that did not comply with the park rules. These rules require that trailers must be roadworthy, licensed, insured, good tires and neat appearance. The rules apply to everyone, including long term parking and widow/widowers row.

PARK QUESTIONS discussed

- a. Do we allow dangerous breed dogs into the park
- b. Should we ask the park cat, "Wally" to be adopted?
- c. Should we contract a company to mow the park?
- d. Should we install a better sign for people driving South on Hwy 75?
- e. Should we have a second pickup of trash during rally weekends at over \$300 for the one pickup?
- f. Should we open the bathrooms for the last rallies of the year?
- g. How do we handle meal preparations for rallies without a volunteer for the Kitchen Manager's position?
- h. Do we need a new laptop for the Board?
- i. How do we manage sites for winter visitors and others that want to park their trailer at the TOP over the winter? Can we use the center section of the lower level for this purpose without any water hookups?
- j. Campers liability Some are not aware of the liability of ALL campers at the TOP = **park at your own risk**. The park is not responsible for any damages to your trailer, or tow vehicle. This disclaimer is common in most campgrounds.

6. IMPROVED CHECK-IN PROCEDURE – No changes are planned for the near future, but an electronic solution would provide a better alternative.

BENEFITS of improved check-in procedures:

a. Database would allow immediate tracking of number of trailers in the park. Presently, the host must count the paper registrations or consult an updated parking map.

b. Historical data could track park usage to predict rally attendance and serve as a tool for financial and project planning. c. Distinctions between temporary campers and long term campers can be determined, thereby distinguishing "pay upon departure" guests and monthly paying guests.

- 7. LAUNDRY At the October meeting, the majority of board members passed the motion to construct a laundry facility with two washers and two dryers. This will be a cabin type building delivered and installed on a foundation and located outside the pavilion in the grassy area in front of the archive room. Many of the non-board members in attendance were in favor of this decision.
- 8. SISTER CLUB RALLIES AT THE TOP After months of inviting other clubs to utilize our park, the Argosy and Palmetto Cove held rallies at the TOP! Due to some scheduling confusion, both clubs visited our park on the same weekend in mid-August! We knew that this heavier than normal use of our park could provide some unique challenges.

The park was nearly full and both clubs were very appreciative of our hospitality! Many thanks to the Meeks, Siblys, Sells, Jumpers, Fontanezs, Rabrens and others that made this "experiment" a success! One of the many compliments we received was based on our extremely low nightly rates of \$15 for WBCCI members and \$20 for non-WBCCI members for full hookups, internet and TV!

9. UPGRADING SITES – The board approved the funds to improve our infrastructure by upgrading the sites B1-B16 with new electrical pedestals, frost proof water connections and new cable connections. This will give us more

availability during the winter months! We have plans to perform upgrades to the rest of the park one section at a time.

10. CABLE/INTERNET - The board is currently investigating the possibility of upgrading the entire park to a higher speed internet service. With the increase of members and visitors in the park there is a greater demand for the service. We have a committee looking into our best options.

FINALLY – Your board members have spent many hours volunteering on Committees and working to keep our park clean and beautiful! The 2019/2020 Board was humbled to be elected by you, the membership, and performed all tasks, cognizant of the fact we represent you! This year's president was blessed by superb teamwork and support in all facets of administering the club and park! We as a club have been recipients of many hundreds of hours of volunteerism that results in one of the finest parks in the country!

SISTER RALLIES 2020

ne goal of our PR Committee has been to show off our beautiful park to other Airstream groups, build relationships with other Airstream Clubs, and, of course, increase Park revenue. The wonderful video and presentation made at the International Rally in Virginia last year no doubt led to an increase in out-of-state visitors to our Park in 2019 and also created interest for other clubs to have rallies, the Palmetto State Airstream Club Unit #22 and the Appalachian Argosy Adventure Group. We hadn't planned to host two groups at once, but it worked out just fine. Our President and First Lady, Tim & Caroyl Johnson, parked the 23 SC Airstreams in the middle and upper loop and 9 Argosies in the lower loop with military precision. It was fun to see the Park full, flags flying, people everywhere, and those funky Argosies providing some color.

In preparation for the rallies, John and Mary Anne Meeks pressure washed the Pavilion and cleaned the kitchen for use by the Palmetto club. Kimberly Funderburg made decorative signs reminding everyone to social distance. Rick Sibly arranged to have the dumpster emptied on

Friday afternoon, so we would not have an overflow before the regular Tuesday pick up. Bear alert! Other dedicated volunteers stepped in to make the Park look its best. (BTW, we need more volunteers.)

Many of the sister rally people came in well before the Friday starts and some stayed after the Sunday finishes enjoying the camaraderie in the Park, the beauty of the surrounding area, and the kitsch that is Helen. The Argosy people mainly stayed in the lower loop and entertainment for the folks in silver was to walk down there and check them out. While in the Park, a popular congregation point for the Palmetto folks was the Upper Shelter replete with their Club Flag hanging from the mantel. They played Bingo in the Pavilion Friday evening and had breakfast and a Low Country Boil on Saturday. Most of their cooking equipment they brought with them and they left the kitchen spic and span.

Now, for the question many have asked, how can other groups have a rally at the Top when we have not? The answer to that is caution. COVID-19 is still an issue. The Board of the Georgia Club felt that they could not take the chance of exposing anyone to this virus. The Palmetto and Argosy Clubs assumed that liability on their own. The Top of Georgia is still taking baby steps in that direction.

There are lessons learned from these two sister rallies. Palmetto has tentatively scheduled another for August 2021. In the meantime, we have time to refine the process. If you'd like to be on the Committee to help with that, please let Tim know.

Argosy Fun Fact: Did you know that Argosies are made of aluminum that wasn't quite good enough to meet Airstream standards, so they painted it? I always thought they were fiberglass. At the Top, we have two Argosies belonging to regulars Sammy, Christee, and Jacob Fontanez and also Doug Ralston and Jaime Collins. Some of the Argosies that visited were painted in bright colors, with a red and white and a yellow and white with matching décor inside and out. The next time you're polishing your Airstream, think about paying \$6,000 to have it painted.
