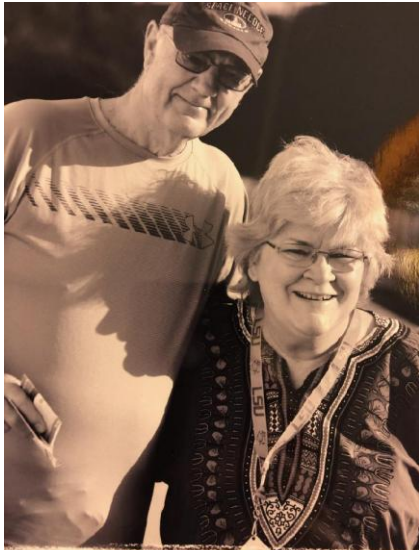

Laundry Room Rules

Open 8am to 8pm

See host for time sign-up, payment, instruction and septic-safe soap, if needed.

\$2.50 washer/\$2.50 dryer (pay host or add it to your park ticket)

Have to use septic safe soap (NO detergent)

No liquid fabric softener in the washer (Fabric sheets can be used in the dryer)

No bleach

No sleeping bags or heavy bedding (such as quilts or comforters)

No dog or cat beds

No carpets or floor mats

**Help keep our laundry room tidy!
Be sure to clean lint filters after each use and report any issues to the host right away**

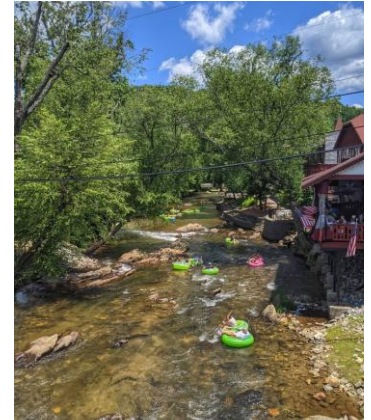
For four days in June, we turned over the Top to the nicest gang of eleven children.

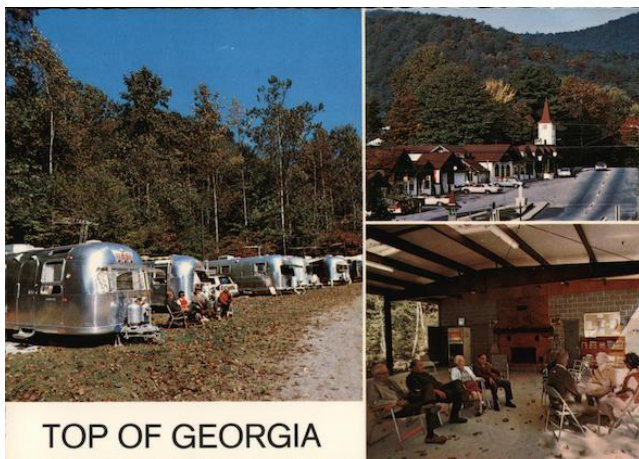

He enjoys hiking and scuba diving and grilling for the family and listening to vinyl.



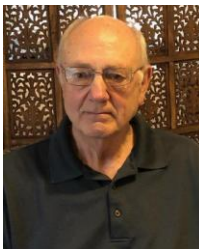
Justin Gaines – Director

Let's Talk about the Sewer System!



After many years of requesting and planning, we finally have a laundry room. However, in order to keep the laundry room open to all, we all must do our part in being "Septic System Aware".

Septic systems rely on bacteria to break down wastes and solids, but these bacteria need a specific environment to survive. If you put the wrong kind of detergent in the washing machine or you use the wrong tub/toilet cleaner, you can end up killing the bacteria, rendering your septic system ineffective.

This can lead to overflows, clogs, flooded drain fields and even contamination of our drinking well.

Laundry Detergents kill bacteria
(ONLY septic-safe laundry soap!)

NO bleach in the washers or bleach cleaners in your kitchen sink

NO fabric softeners in the washers
