Winter Parking/Storage Announcements and Upcoming Projects that may affect you!

November 5, 2022, water will be turned off to the lower section of the Park.

Different from last year, the lower-center Section D will remain open (no trailer parking) for ground repairs. No trailers shall be in this area for winter.

Section C 15-30 shall also remain open (no trailer parking) beginning November 4th for tree removal and trimming, and ground repairs.

Over-the-winter storage of trailers will be in Section S of the lower area. This is limited to 10 trailers on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Beginning November 7th 2022

1. New electrical pedestals and water lines will be installed in the upper-section A 1-20 and creek-side section B 17-32. Section B will be first, followed by Section A; trailers will need to be moved in order for work to begin.
2. A new roof will be installed on the upper (fireplace) shelter.
3. Concrete parking pad repairs

Items completed this year:

1. Dog Park - fenced and completed.
2. Fiber-optic Wi-Fi installed and operational throughout the park.
3. New garden tool shed with labels for tool placement and organization.
4. New tractor barn installed.
5. Painting of the main pavilion completed.
6. Built a closet for apparel items.
7. Enclosed an area for Wi-Fi equipment to be housed.

8. New closet for musical instruments to be stored.
9. Dumpsters have been bear-proofed.

*Please, use front dumpster for kitchen and household garbage, and rear for non-food items.
10. New fans and lights installed in the screened back porch of the main pavilion.
11. Removed 7 trees.
12. Tools, gifted from members, have been added to the shop.

Safety Event

Fall Rally 2022, October 15, from 9am-noon

Following up to our two successful Safety Day events in May and October, 2021, we have secured our safety team for our fall event.

Our goal is to keep safety on everyone's "radar", so we can enjoy our trailers safely and securely.

What we hope to achieve;

Provide instruction and informal activities to review safety as a priority for TOG and with park members.

Cover topics, which can be easily overlooked, like fire extinguishers and smoke/CO detectors.



Review our current safety and emergency response procedures in the park. Example: During our past safety event the defibrillator was checked and we completed CPR training last October as recommended by Helen Fire Department.

What we have planned;

We have secured "Iron Mike" to address hiking safety and, more specifically, hiking safely on the Appalachian Trail. We have spectacular hiking venues in our North Georgia mountains and we want our members and guests to enjoy them with least amount of risk

We have Helen Fire Department and EMS joining us for the 3rd time to help us increase our knowledge and help us address safety issues within the park and our trailers. They will also provide hand-outs to participants regarding safety.



Peach State Fire has agreed to provide a safety demonstration using fire extinguishers in a "controlled burn" setting. Peach State Fire will also have the capability to charge or exchange extinguishers, so bring those from your trailers.

Hiking the Appalachian Trail with "IRON MIKE"

Come to the October Fall Installation Rally and hear Iron Mike speak about hiking safety on Saturday morning, October 15 during our Safety Day presentations. Then again at 2 PM on Saturday about hiking the Appalachian Trail (AT).







Iron Mike is an Airstream owner who has been hiking the AT since 1990 (32 years). He began this quest when sponsoring his son's Boy Scout troop in pursuit of their hiking badges. He was given his moniker, Iron Mike, by other hikers who said that he was a strong plodder, keeping after his goal of piecemeal hiking until he covers the entire trail.

Come view his pictures, ask him how many toenails he loses each hike, and meet a really great guy. If you have any interest in hiking, this seminar is for you.

Incentive Parking for Board and Officers

The Board has established a committee to review our existing parking program for officers to ensure it is equitable and consistent. Here are the primary goals outlined by this committee based upon their work to date.

1. **Published policy** regarding incentives parking in both the officers' handbooks and the host guide, which provide clear expectations and guidelines of the program.
2. Thorough review of **financial impact** of the program with an annual review financially of the incentives parking program. Provide clear instructions on the incentives parking spot criteria for hook ups.
3. **Inventory** of those receiving **benefits** to evaluate the consistency that reflects the values of the Club and ensure that equity of the program is maintained.
4. **Transparency** of the program published in the Caravanner.
5. **Signage** reflecting the assigned spots. Clear policy regarding the locations of the incentive parking spots. Explicit guidelines regarding those receiving the incentive parking benefit who select other locations.
